


**Introduction:** Given the reinstatement by the Bishops of New Jersey of the obligation to attend Sunday Mass and the lessening of restrictions from the state, the following is provided as an update to the May 25 COVID-19 directives.

**STILL IN EFFECT:** Masks will no longer be required for fully vaccinated persons. If not fully vaccinated, persons are strongly encouraged to follow CDC guidance and wear a face mask in public settings. Masks are still required on public transit and in health care settings, prisons, child-care facilities and schools, among other places. People will no longer be required to socially distance indoors or outdoors, although unvaccinated persons should continue to maintain a safe distance from others. These directives apply to all indoor and outdoor events.

**LITURGICAL MINISTERS:** All ministries may return to full service – altar servers, lectors, ushers, greeters and extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion. Masks are no longer required for all vaccinated ministers, including those distributing Communion (Priests, Deacons, and EMs). However, masks may be worn for those who prefer to wear one during the liturgy.

**COMMUNION:** While Communion on the tongue is now permitted, for the safety of the priests, ministers and other communicants, we encourage continued reception of communion in the hand. At this time, Communion from the cup should not be distributed to the assembly.

**SANITIZING:** The cleaning and sanitizing of churches and common spaces should be done regularly. It is not required after every liturgy.

**SIGN OF PEACE:** The invitation to share the Sign of Peace should continue. Parishioners could be reminded that it is not required to touch during the sign of peace.

**OFFERTORY COLLECTION:** Ushers may take up the collection at the proper time or baskets may be placed at the entrance of the church for the collection. (Beginning July 17, 2021)

**BAPTISMAL FONTS:** Baptismal fonts and holy water receptacles may be filled.

**MUSIC:** Vaccinated music ministers (cantors, choirs, etc.) do not require masks or shields. Music ministers who are not vaccinated should wear a mask. All musical instruments are permitted. Hymnals are now permitted.

**PARISH MEETINGS:** Parish meetings in person may resume. Those vaccinated are not required to wear masks for indoor meetings nor are they required to maintain social distancing. The same recommendations for Mass apply to those not vaccinated.

**PRESENTATION OF GIFTS:** The procession to present the gifts of bread and wine and the collection can be resumed. (Beginning July 17, 2021)

Faith Formation Program Options & Basic Info for 2022-2023

Sacrament Preparation Programs: All preparation programs for First Reconciliation, First Communion and Confirmation (8th & 9th gr) will remain unchanged from this current year's in-person format. Details for 2022-2023 will be shared in separate emails to families whose children will be preparing for these sacraments.

"New" Summer Families of Faith 2022: Building on our previous "pre-covid" Summer Academy model, there will be one on-site session for children which will run from Mon., June 27th - Fri. July 8th, with the day off on Mon., July 4th for the holiday. For the morning component for the children (which will look very much like our pre-covid Summer Academy Program), we are planning to offer PreK 3/4 through 8th grade, from 8:45am - 1pm. Please note that our ability to offer each grade level will hinge on whether we can identify catechists for each grade. Please let me know if you would like information about serving as a grade level catechist.

**Sth grade Discipleship Academy:** Assuming we have sufficient catechists and parent coverage for this program, 8th gr Discipleship Academy will take place on-site during the same time frame as Summer Families of Faith. No separate registration is required, it is the program for any rising 8th grader who is signed up for Summer Families of Faith. Although this program is not required for Confirmation preparation, it is highly recommended as it offers an excellent opportunity for fellowship, learning and group service projects.

**Fall - Spring Families of Faith 2022-2023:** During the school-year, Families of Faith will run from October through April, meeting on two Sunday mornings of each month. Families will gather from 8:30 - 9:45am for a variety of activities including learning, service projects, and fellowship. The group will then attend the 10am Mass together.

<u>At Home Families of Faith 2022-2023</u>: For any family who does not feel comfortable coming back in person to the parish or who cannot participate in one of the onsite Families of Faith programs due to scheduling conflicts or for other reasons, they may opt to register for At-Home Families of Faith.

**<u>Registration for 2022-2023 Programs:</u>** Registration will begin on March 1st. The deadline will be June 1st.
