

How to Report Abuse:

The Archdiocese of Newark takes very seriously any and all credible complaints of sexual abuse of minors by members of the clergy, religious, lay staff and volunteers of the Archdiocese. We encourage anyone with knowledge of an act of sexual abuse of a minor to inform the Archdiocese immediately so that we can take appropriate action to protect others and provide support to victims of sexual abuse.

Archdiocese of Newark - COVID-19 Directives - Updated May 15, 2022

STILL IN EFFECT: Masks will no longer be required for fully vaccinated persons. If not fully vaccinated, persons are strongly encouraged to follow CDC guidance and wear a face mask in public settings. People will no longer be required to socially distance indoors or outdoors, although unvaccinated persons should continue to maintain a safe distance from others. These directives apply to Masses and activities in Church. Archdiocesan protocols for Religious Education and Basketball programs remain in effect.

LITURGICAL MINISTERS: All ministries may return to full service – altar servers, lectors, ushers, greeters and extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion. Ministers of Holy Communion must still sanitize their hands and wear a mask when distributing Communion.

COMMUNION: While Communion on the tongue is now permitted, for the safety of the priests, ministers and other communicants, we encourage continued reception of communion in the hand. At this time, Communion from the cup should not be distributed to the assembly.

SANITIZING: The cleaning and sanitizing of churches and common spaces is done regularly. It is not required after every liturgy.

PARISH MEETINGS: Parish meetings in person may resume. Those vaccinated are not required to wear masks for indoor meetings nor are they required to maintain social distancing. The same recommendations for Mass apply to those not vaccinated.

A Message from the Pastoral Associate John McGuire In our Catholic tradition, there are three people that were born without sin. Jesus as both God and Man. The Blessed Virgin Mary, Immaculately Conceived and called to be the Mother of God. Then there was John the Baptist, who was Christened within the womb, as he jumped for joy before birth, in the presence of Jesus during the Visitation. Those of us outside of that group of three were born with Original Sin. We recognize this as we baptize our children. While in Baptism we are forgiven of our Original Sin, and are reborn in Christ Jesus, we still struggle with the challenges, temptations, and the imperfections that entered into the world with the Fall of Adam and Eve. The Lord and His Church offer something to strengthen our faith, and address the struggles that we face in our journey. These are called sacraments. There is the before mentioned Baptism. We can daily, or more likely weekly receive Jesus in the Eucharist. When sick, or dying we can find strength from the Anointing of the Sick. In Confirmation we are empowered by the Holy Spirit. Those of us who are married find strength and grace from Matrimony, and our priests and deacons are sealed in their Ordination for ministry. An important and often forgotten sacrament is Reconciliation or Confession. Many of us forget that this is available, or shy away from it out of pride or fear. The way many of us had been raised, this was just a step on the way to Eucharist, Confirmation, and perhaps other sacraments. During our Summer Families of Faith, I asked our 3rd through 8th graders who had remembered the last time they had gone to Confession, all but the third graders were puzzled. They were then all offered and accepted the opportunity to take part in the sacrament. If you have not participated in this sacrament, I encourage you to do so with your families. Perhaps go back once, see how it feels. You might feel that it would be helpful to go back once a month, or a few times a year. However, I beg of you, do not let this grace go to waste. Every time we confess our sins, we have a true experience of Jesus, and the weight of our sins is lifted. This week, pray for the courage to accept Jesus' forgiveness, for the strength of our families, and a fuller experience of the strength given us through the Sacraments. God Bless and have a wonderful week. - John McGuire
